President's Message Stephen Arner

The ski season at Sugarloaf is winding down as I write this, although the resort was lucky enough to get a surprise 12" of powder on April 9. And the snow really was powdery, not the heavy stuff one might expect at this time of year. ReggaeFest is firing up this weekend, with a bit more snow in the forecast. The mountain will be open through the weekend of April 27, with hope to be open into early May. To date, the mountain is reporting 160" of snow accumulation this winter. That is below the reported 200" average snowfall that some sources claim for Sugarloaf, but actually a bit higher than the average if you look only at the data going back to 2012-13. I was surprised to find that in a few seasons (dating back to the late 1960s) Sugarloaf has received less than 70" of snow in a season! At any rate, it certainly felt like the number of wind holds was higher than average, but I didn't try to find statistics to back up my perception.

Meanwhile, the Ski Club is in great shape and already preparing for next season. The club has over a million dollars in assets and plans to award over \$100,000 in ski and snowboard scholarships next year (including Kings' Kids). Athletes we have supported continue to excel in multiple disciplines, including alpine, ski and snowboard cross, freestyle, rail jams, and moguls. We plan to continue mailing out newsletters and supporting social events, in addition to our main focus of providing opportunities for youth to participate in and excel in skiing and snowboarding. The pot luck social at the Competition Center this week was wellattended and it seemed to me a good time was had by all. Many also gathered a few days prior to that to attend a celebration of life for Leverett ("Lev") Steeves, who passed away

in January. Most of you no doubt knew Lev and know that he was a dedicated race volunteer and was integral to the locals race league for more than



three decades. The locals race league trophy has been named the Lev Steeves Cup in his honor, and additionally, the Volunteer of the Year Award will now also bear his name (along with Gleason Rand's). Lev will be missed but his legacy remains.

We plan to continue Tuesday night socials next ski season and will likely be working in conjunction with Sugarloaf to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the Club and Sugarloaf. If you have any ideas regarding social events, or would like to assist with them, we'd love to hear from you! Indeed, your input regarding any of the Club's events and plans is welcome.

We have a few events coming up that you may want to add to your calendar. First up, is the 44th Annual Golf Classic scheduled for June 20. There will be volunteer, sponsorship and tournament entry opportunities. Check the website for more details coming soon. Another club fundraiser, Swig and Swing, is scheduled to return October 10. And finally, our annual meeting is scheduled for December 6.

I hope everyone has a great summer and those interested are able to check out Sugarloaf's coming bike park and lift-serviced mountain biking, still on track to open this summer:

Awards and luncheon at Golf Club House included at 2:30 pm.




2025 Sugarloaf Locals Race Series



In 2018 we launched a new program with a generous \$500,000 gift from the H. King and Jean Cummings Charitable Fund. This gift is the foundation of an endowment fund (now at \$1.3 million) for the King's Kids initiative to help kids ages 5-15 in Franklin and Somerset counties learn to alpine ski, snowboard, and nordic ski and to support other local initiatives. Sixth season accomplishments

Winter 2024 King's Kids funded the following:

 Kids from RSU 58, RSU 74, Stratton, andRangeley participated in the 8-Sunday PM Boomuager program through the Sugarloaf Perfect Tum Ski School. King's Kids underwrote over 75% of the cost of this program, including <u>lift ticket</u>, <u>lessons</u>, <u>and</u> <u>rentals</u>. Each child only paid \$40 for the entire 8 session program.

- King's Kids assisted the Titcomb Mtn.
 Ski & Snowboard programs
- All volunteer run Baker Mountain in Moscow and Spruce Mountain in Jay were given funds by King's Kids..
- Many local children received scholarshipsto Sugarloaf Mini & Bubblecuffer programs (in addition to significant monies from other club funds).
- We awarded several thousand dollars to Stratton and Mt Abram Schools to help with middle and high school ski teams.

For 2025 season:

We have the Boomauger Jr.pro program. This program is designed to train 14-15 year olds to become instructors of skiing or snowboarding.

The Boomauger program pro, vides local kids with 8 days of skiing or snowboarding lifts, lessons and rentals at the low cost of just \$40 for all 8 sessions. Nordic Boomaugers is only \$8King's Kid's had a verysuccessful fifthseason
