### Sugarloaf/USA and Carrabassett Valley Academy (SCVA) Competition Programs

Sugarloaf/USA and Carrabassert Vailey Academy are teamed together to offer junior competition programs, more commonly known as SCVA, for skiers and snowboarders ages 8 to 19 (male and female), from early December to the end of March. The Academy provides highly qualified coaches in all disciplines including Freestyle, Alpine, and Snowboarding.

Joan McWilliams Dolan, Program Director for the Freestyle program, offers young, aspiring athletes the opportunity to compete in mogul and jumping events at Sugarloaf/USA and all USSA sanctioned events in New England. Dolan recently stated, "SCVA is the most important weekend program CVA has to offer. The weekend programs are critical to the Academy's current and future successes in both recruiting new students and in shaping elite level athletes."

Jeff Hawksley (Hawk) remains the Program Director for the Alpine program. This program continues to offer competitive ski-racing opportunities to all levels of skiers, with racers grouped according to ability and age. Hawk is well known for his capacity to help shape young athletes into strong technical ski racers, while at the same time a huge emphasis is placed on having FUN!

Kevin Bushey rounds out the team as the Program Director for the Snowboarding program. The Snowboarding program takes competitors to new heights, building a strong foundation in freestyle riding and competing in snowboard events at Sugarloaf/USA.

### Sugarloaf Outdoor Center preparing for another exciting season: Opening day scheduled for November 16

Season passes are still available and taxpayers may still enjoy reduced rates. Property owner fees for 2002/2003 are \$175/ adult and \$125/ JR (6-12) and SR (60+). 

# Carrabassett Valley Academy is proud to be celebrating its 20th Anniversary this academic year 2002-2003

The Academy, founded by H. King Cummings and other enthusiastic pioneers in 1982, is the off-shoot of the Sugarloaf Regional Ski Educational Foundation (SRSEF), which began operations in 1969 "to help racers and freestylers sharpen their skills for competitive skiing." Later in 1972, the Maine State Board of Education granted academic approval for the SRSEF's tutorial program. In September 1983, Carrabassett Valley Academy (CVA) first opened its doors at the former Capricorn Lodge as a full-time ski academy and college preparatory program with 15 students.

Today, the former Capricorn Lodge, with the addition of the Lumberjack Ski Dorm, symbolizes life at the Academy as it did for its first students twenty years ago. For each succeeding class since 1982, these buildings have been remolded, renovated and re-designed to meet the ever-growing needs of the Academy, its faculty and students. As we enter into the Academy's twentieth year of operations, CVA is bursting at the seams with 110 students!

Throughout the year the Academy will be celebrating its past, present, and future successes. There will be a celebration during October 2002 in Portland. Contact CVA for details.


